To date, they have awarded \$104,000 in scholarships to 130 students. Murray claimed to be better at everything than Crump was, especially golf. **Gary Woods** pointed out that he worked for Spanky Roberts once, presumably meaning that Spanky had something to do with one of our local banks.
